Instructions

The "Marshal Keys" from Lockmasters are designed to allow you to quickly and easily pick open the majority of GM, Ford & Chrysler vehicles equipped with the new style double-sided locks. While these keys will work well on most of these vehicles, you must understand that like any picking tools, these tools **ARE NOT** guaranteed to work 100% of the time.

In addition, the more you practice with these picking tools, the better your success rate will be. Be patient as you practice, the time spent in practicing will be rewarded with quicker openings in the field as you develop a feel for the tools.


Step 1 - First identify the correct key for use with the vehicle that you intend to unlock by using the photos below. After selecting the appropriate key, insert the key into the door lock.

Step 2 - Apply pressure to the key as if you were turning the lock toward the unlocked position and work the key in and out at the same time. An up and down rocking motion of the key will also help in the process of picking the lock. **If you feel the key begin to tighten up inside the lock, this means that the lock is nearly picked.** At this point only a small movement of the key will be required to pick the lock, but you may have to apply more pressure to the key at the same time.

NOTE - If after a time you feel that the lock is not going to pick, remove the key, turn it over and try it again with the key inserted the other way. In addition, if you are unsuccessful at picking one lock on the vehicle, you may wish to try picking the lock on the opposite door if it is equipped with a lock.

Hints and Tips

- 1. Be patient. The more you practice with Marshal Keys, the better your success rate will become.
- 2. Worn locks often pick easier than new locks. Try the driver's side door first since it usually has more wear than the passenger side.
- 3. **Do not lubricate the lock.** When picking a lock, friction is your friend. A well-lubricated lock is almost always harder to pick.
- 4. If possible, **refer to Steve Young's Quick Entry Car Opening Manual** for the direction of turn of the lock before you begin picking so that you can pick the lock in the correct direction the first time.
- 5. If you successfully pick the lock in the wrong direction, it can often be "flipped" to the unlocked position by spinning the key very quickly.
